Nurse Ethan Struggled – But Your Kindness Kept Him Going



In May of 2021, Norton Police Chief James Lane was shot several times while responding to a shoplifting call. After several weeks in the hospital and rehab, Chief Lane returned home, but in a wheelchair.

His injuries make him more susceptible to complications from COVID-19.

One recent Friday morning, Chief Lane woke up not feeling well. As the day progressed, he got worse. He knew it was time to go get tested. He made his way to the Health Wagon Clinic in Wise at about 4 p.m. where the staff worked him in.

"They stayed late so I could get my results. They were so kind," Chief Lane said.

Shortly before 6 p.m., he got the news that he was positive for COVID-19. They encouraged him to come back the next day to get a monoclonal antibody infusion.

"With me being in a wheelchair, and the winter weather, and having to depend on people to help me, it's just hard to leave the house. I really didn't think I'd be able to get the treatment," the Chief told us.

But that just wasn't going to work for Dr. Teresa Tyson, the Health Wagon's CEO.

She sent nurses Ethan and Tammy on a house call to take the infusion to Chief Lane.

"Tammy and Ethan explained everything to me and made me feel very comfortable and safe to receive the treatment. They were so professional," Chief Lane said.

"It was such an act of kindness and made all the difference in the world."

Monoclonal antibodies are one of the most effective treatments for COVID-19. Thank you for providing the support needed to offer this treatment to Chief Lane. It's very possible you saved his life!

Ethan Collins has worked as a nurse for 10 years, first as an RN and then as a Nurse Practitioner. He's been with the Health Wagon for the last 4 years.

He's always loved being a family nurse practitioner.

Ethan has been on the front lines of the pandemic since the beginning in March of 2020.

"I've never seen *anything* like this," he said. "It can strike anybody, anywhere – the young, the old, the sick, the healthy. COVID is not choosy."

One day just a few weeks ago, Ethan had worked more than 12 hours treating almost 100 people with COVID-19 at the Health Wagon Clinic in Wise. That night, he was driving home and was absolutely exhausted. He had been living in a state of constant exhaustion for months, but this night, in particular, hit him hard.

"I don't know how much longer I can keep up this pace," he thought to himself.

But he quickly gave himself a gut check. He searched deeply.

"This is what I trained for," he thought to himself.
"I was trained to respond to disaster. And if I don't do it – if I quit – who will pick up for me?"

That's just how dedicated Ethan is to the precious people of poverty-stricken Appalachian Virginia.

And he found some strength from you, too.

That very night, he thought about the thousands of people – you included – who've donated to the Health Wagon, maybe even sacrificially.

"The funding we receive from our donors provides tests, education, vaccines, and treatments for COVID and other illnesses," Ethan said emotionally. "There is a life at the end of every dollar that's given. Donors are truly saving lives."

Every dollar you gave in 2021 (or earlier), works together with others and has a tremendously positive effect on the people in one of the poorest areas of America.

COVID-19

COVID-19 remains the most pressing issue in our service area. Because of you, in 2021 at three stationary clinics and five mobile units, the Health Wagon was able to provide:

14,889 COVID-19 tests

3,787 COVID-19 vaccinations

3,700 monoclonal antibody treatments

40,000 masks distributed

As emergency rooms and hospitals filled up with COVID-19 patients in the region, they called on the Health Wagon's mobile units to provide testing and treatment.

This kept children and adults alike out of emergency rooms and hospital beds and that helped keep the hospital system from failing.

Monoclonal antibody treatments remain the most effective and abundant treatment option for people who test positive for COVID-19.

And because of you, the Health Wagon established the only mobile monoclonal antibody infusion center in the nation where we're able to administer hundreds of transfusions every day.

To date, not a single person who has been treated through the Health Wagon with monoclonal antibodies has died and only a handful have had to be hospitalized.

With your support, the Health Wagon stood in the gap, providing mitigation and treatment options for COVID, keeping poverty-stricken Appalachia from losing thousands upon thousands of our precious people in this vulnerable population.

You are TRULY saving lives!





You paved the way for a one-of-a-kind clinic.

In 2021, with your support, the Health Wagon opened a post-COVID-19 clinic to help treat people with lingering COVID-19 symptoms, most commonly known as "long-haul COVID-19."

Patients' post-COVID-19 symptoms range from mild fatigue and shortness of breath to disabling events like organ damage.

Medical providers are learning a lot through the clinic, and it's the only one of its kind among free clinics in the United States.

You made it possible!



Medical

Beyond COVID-19, the most common conditions treated at the Health Wagon were heart disease, diabetes, lung disease, depression, and cancer.

Unfortunately, COVID-19 hasn't ended the need for people to receive medical care for other illnesses. We continue to provide free preventive, primary, and specialty care.

With your support, the Health Wagon is still treating injuries, everyday illnesses like strep, flu, and sinus infections, and life-threatening conditions.

We're still providing childhood vaccinations and other vaccines for things like the flu and shingles.



And through Pharmacy Connect, the Health Wagon helps patients significantly lower their prescription costs or even get them for free.

Whether at our three stationary clinics or at more remote locations visited by our five mobile units, you make it possible for deserving people to receive free, quality health care.



A simple blood test revealed that Matthew was sick with Hepatitis C. For years, Matthew went to the emergency room at the local hospital any time he was sick. Uninsured and unable to afford to visit a traditional doctor's office, it was the only way he could see a health care provider.

Then, he lost nearly 40 pounds in a matter of just a few weeks.

He saw 10 health care providers, underwent a battery of tests including endoscopy, colonoscopy, CT with contrast, heart monitoring, blood tests, and ultrasounds. No diagnosis was ever made.

"I was withering away," he said.

Finally, he made an appointment with Cara, a family nurse practitioner at the Health Wagon. A simple blood test revealed that Matthew was sick with Hepatitis C. Cara immediately got him on a treatment regimen and today, he's completely cured and back up to a healthy weight!

Vision

Every year, hundreds of people, young and old, come to the Health Wagon Vision Clinic where they receive a complete screening for vision issues and diseases of the eye.

There are examination rooms and diagnostic rooms onsite where patients can pick out frames, and lenses are made right at the clinic.

And because of you, no one ever has to worry about how they'll pay.





Eli's reading difficulties were fixed with a few weeks of vision therapy! Like many of the Health Wagon's patients, Lynn is underinsured. Her employer provides medical insurance, but it doesn't include dental or vision insurance.

Without your generosity and the Health Wagon Vision Clinic, she couldn't afford to take her children to the eye doctor.

When Lynn's son, Eli, turned 7, she thought it was time to take him for a vision screening at the Health Wagon.

Tests determined that Eli could see with 20/20 vision but...

the vision provider saw something troubling inside his eye. So, Eli was referred to a pediatric eye specialist.

After many tests, it was determined that Eli had an eye tracking disorder and it was causing him to have difficulty reading. This was actually a relief because Eli had been struggling in school. His teacher and pediatrician were talking to Lynn about testing for learning disabilities.

Instead, Eli's reading difficulties were fixed with a few weeks of vision therapy!

The Health Wagon's Patient Outreach Coordinator is working with Lynn to help her receive financial support for the treatment.

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Poor dental health has been linked to life-threatening conditions – diabetes, arthritis, heart disease, and kidney disease are just a few.

Studies also show that people with decaying teeth have a harder time finding a job, getting promotions, and they may even receive lower salaries.

It's already hard to find a job in Southwest Virginia.

Dental care significantly increases the overall well-being of the families you support, especially when it's provided for free.

In 2021, 2,164 dental patients were treated in our mobile units thanks to you.

But there are so many more waiting. We need to build a stationary dental clinic.

And thanks to amazing donors like YOU, the Health Wagon will break ground on a dental clinic in 2022!

Not only will this make it possible to treat hundreds more patients each year, but this will also free up the mobile units to reach more isolated areas.





You Provided 2 Additional Mobile Units in 2021!

In 1980, Sister Bernie Kenny with the order of Medical Missionaries of Mary loaded up her Volkswagen Beetle with medical supplies. She traveled on rural mountain roads to deliver health care to individuals in the mountainous region of poverty-stricken Southwest Virginia.

Today, the Health Wagon hails as the oldest mobile medical unit in the country.

And thanks to you, we were able to add two additional mobile units in 2021, making it possible to reach some of the poorest and most remote people in the country with quality, compassionate health care.

If it weren't for your generosity, these precious people would have no access to health services at all!

In addition to reaching remote areas of Southwest Virginia, Eastern Kentucky, and Northeast Tennessee, our mobile units traveled to Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Missouri, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Texas, Vermont, and West Virginia to treat patients.

The Health Wagon currently operates five mobile health units.





IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)

If you are 70½ or older and own an IRA, you may make a direct transfer of up to \$100,000 annually from your IRA to St. Mary's Health Wagon without having to include the withdrawal in your adjusted gross income for income tax purposes.

- Donor must be 70 ½ or older.
- Donation must come from a traditional or inherited IRA.
- The maximum annual gift transfer is \$100,000 per donor.
- Transfers must go directly to a recognized charitable organization such as the Health Wagon. Be careful. The money cannot go to you first.
- Donation counts toward satisfying donor's required minimum distribution but is not included in adjusted gross income.

Planned Giving or Gifts Outside of Wills

If you wish to include the Health Wagon in gifts outside of wills, including gifts like a charitable lead trust, charitable lead annuity trust, bargain sale, and retained life estate, which all avoid probate, as well as gifts of assets like appreciated securities, retirement plans, insurance policies, and real estate, please contact Rachel Helton at rhelton@thehealthwagon.org.
